The Ten Lepers

GRATEFUL PAPER TWIRLERS

Materials needed

Card stock with circle drawn

Circle already drawn

Crayons

Scissors

Watercolor paint and brush

Hole punch

Yarn

Cut out the circle.

Starting from the edge of the circle draw a spiral to the center of the circle.

With crayon write or draw between the lines the things/people you are thankful for.

Paint the whole circle with watercolor paint. Let dry. Turn the circle over and paint the reverse side.

Cut along the spiral line.

Punch a hole in the spiral (the part that was at the center of the circle) and tie a piece of yarn through it. Hang your paper twirler in front of the window so you can watch it twirl.
