

Oil and Water Object Lesson

You will need:

- 12-ounce clear plastic cup, with 2 inches of vinegar in it.
- 1 small paper cup with 1 tbsp of baking soda
- 1 small paper cup with 1 tbsp of cooking oil

In this activity, the kids will be mixing materials to create a harmless chemical reaction. This activity can be messy, so be prepared with towels. Set out the cups with the ingredients already in them.

Say: Let's try this experiment to see what happens when we let Jesus take care of our fears. Let's pretend that the clear cup represents you. The white powder represents the things that scare us. The oil in the other cup represents Jesus.

One person will sprinkle the white powder into the large cup. While they are watching what happens, ask them to think about how they feel when they are scared. Then have another child pour in the oil. Watch what happens. What happened to the liquid when you added the oil. Talk about how Jesus loves us more than we can imagine. He wants us to feel safe and secure. Jesus calms our fears because of his love. Whenever we're afraid, we can ask Jesus to be with us, to comfort us, and to calm us. Jesus will be with us just as He was with the disciples when they were scared. Jesus is the Son of God, Creator of the universe. We can count on Him to calm the storms in our lives. When a fear seems to take hold of us, we can call out to Jesus in prayer and know that He hears us just as He heard the disciples' cries for help.

CRAFT OPTIONS WINDSOCK (EASY)

- Colored construction paper
- Stapler or scotch tape
- Child safe scissors
- ♦ Hole punch
- Curling ribbon
- Decorative tapes, stickers, markers




- 1. Decorate the sheet of construction paper with stickers, coloring, tissue paper pieces, washi tape etc.
- 2. Roll the sheet of decorated construction paper into a cylinder shape and tape or staple the ends together.
- 3. Using the hole puncher, punch 4 or more holes along the bottom of the tube.
- 4. Cut at least 4 lengths of ribbon 2—3 feet long (per hole) and string the ribbon thru the holes.
- 5. Punch two more holes on the top of the windsock. Cut one more piece of ribbon about 6 inches. Tie each end to the two holes.

OCEAN IN A BOTTLE (EASY BUT POTENTIALLY MESSIER)

- Water bottle
- Cooking oil
- ♦ Blue /green food col-oring
- ♦ Water
- ♦ Funnel
- 1. Fill approximately 1/3 of your bottle with water.
- 2. Add several drops of food colouring.
- 3. Shake the bottle to disperse the food coloring
- 4. Using the funnel fill the bottle to the top with cooking oil.
- 5. Replace the lid tightly. Tape over the lid and bottleneck with packing or duct tape to ensure it is not easily opened by a child.


